Source A uses a variety of techniques to persuade students to attend. Positive adjectives like 'phenomenal' and 'impressive' emphasise that the experience is incredible and inspiring. The use of direct address in exclamations such as 'You can't afford to miss it!' also convinces the reader that the experience will be suitable for them personally, and they will have regrets if they do not attend. Commands such as 'Contact Adaptable travel' further convince the reader to attend, whilst emotive language such as 'breathtaking' and 'exciting' encourages the reader to be excited about going to the event.

Compare **Source A** and **Source C**. Write about what they say and how the material is conveyed.

You may want to refer to the level of detail, presentation and language, formality, possible bias and how the writers come across.

[6 marks]

Source A is a persuasive text that uses emotive language like 'breathtaking' to convince makeup students to attend a 'phenomenal learning experience' in London. In contrast, Source C uses historical facts like 'the first men's makeup tools were discovered in ancient China' and statistics like 'approximately 1 in 100 British men wear makeup daily' to inform the reader about men wearing makeup.

Source A uses detailed paragraphs to persuade the reader, and uses shorter paragraphs to give information about how the event will work, dividing information about each day using bold text and using short sentences to give details about pricing and the minimum group size. In contrast, Source C uses a question-and-answer structure, with the interviewer asking questions like 'Is this true for all men?' and Dr Mendosa giving detailed answers to inform the reader about men's makeup.

Both sources use images to illustrate ideas and information. Source A uses images of people wearing dramatic makeup, as well as an image of some makeup products, in order to illustrate the things that the reader might see and do if they attend the event. Source C uses images of pop stars to highlight the bold looks that figures like Ant and Bowie introduced.
